Cameron County Confirms Additional COVID-19 Related Death

Cameron County has received confirmation of an additional COVID-19 related death of a Cameron County Resident. The 78-year old male was a resident of the Windsor Atrium and had been previously reported as a case for Cameron County. This report brings the number of COVID-19 related deaths to twenty-three (23).

“It saddens me to report the loss of another individual from our community to this deadly virus” stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Trevino, Jr. “On behalf of the Cameron County Commissioners’ Court, we extend our deepest sympathies to his family and friends during this difficult time.”

Cameron County has also received confirmation of an additional fifteen (15) reports of COVID-19. This includes the following:

This raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 527 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional eighteen (18) individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 283.

Cameron County Public Health continues to work with the two nursing home facilities in addressing the COVID-19 outbreaks. To date, the Cameron County cases arising from the Veranda Nursing Home has included 32 employees and 60 residents who have tested positive, including ten (10) who have passed away. The Windsor Atrium currently has 32 employees and 57 residents who have tested positive. They have had ten (10) individuals linked to Windsor Atrium who have passed away.

As part of the COVID-19 action response plan, Cameron County Public Health is conducting epidemiological investigations, contact tracing as needed, and continues to monitor the situation.
