**CAMERON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH TO VACCINATE AREA SCHOOL  
DISTRICT TEACHERS AND ALLOCATE FIRST AND SECOND-DOSE VACCINES  
TO SEVERAL MUNICIPALITIES**

In partnership with area school district superintendents, Cameron County will host a COVID-19 mass vaccination clinic on Thursday, March 11, 2021, at the Los Fresnos Fire & EMS Department for area school teachers from the following school districts: Santa Maria ISD, Marine Military Academy, Santa Rosa ISD, Jubilee Academies, Neighbors in Need of Services, Inc., South Texas ISD, Harmony Schools, Diocese of Brownsville, IDEA Public Schools, Los Fresnos ISD, and San Benito ISD.

All teachers will be vaccinated with the Moderna Vaccine and are asked to please arrive at the indicated time by your school district, with your school ID, complete the consent and registration forms ahead of time, and remain in your vehicle upon arrival. Cameron County Public Health allocated vaccines to the City of Brownsville and Harlingen, both approved COVID-19 vaccine providers, in a joint effort to vaccinate their area school district teachers.

Cameron County Public Health allocated first dose-vaccines to the City of Los Fresnos, Los Indios, and Port Isabel, and second-dose vaccines to the City of Brownsville, Harlingen, and San Benito. All individuals are asked to please contact or visit the municipality websites for vaccine availability and registration information.

Cameron County Public Health has partnered with several school districts in Cameron County for continued vaccination allocation efforts and is committed to administering vaccines in accordance with the guidance from the State of Texas and the CDC. Cameron County will provide additional first and second-dose vaccination clinic updates and allocations are confirmed.
