**CAMERON COUNTY TO ALLOCATE FIRST-DOSE MODERNA VACCINES TO  
AREA HOSPITALS, SECOND-DOSE VACCINES TO MUNICIPALITIES,  
AND FIRST AND SECOND-DOSE VACCINES TO PRIMARY  
HEALTH CARE DOCTOR'S OFFICES AND PHARMACIES**

Cameron County Public Health will allocate a limited number of first-dose Moderna Vaccines this week to the following hospitals in Cameron County: Valley Baptist Medical Center Brownsville, Valley Baptist Medical Center Harlingen, Valley Regional Medical Center Brownsville, and Harlingen Medical Center.

Cameron County Public Health will also allocate a limited number of first and second-dose Moderna Vaccines to primary health care doctor's offices and pharmacies, and second-dose vaccines to the following municipalities: Combes, La Feria, Port Isabel, Santa Rosa, and San Benito. The above-listed municipalities will vaccinate those individuals, including area school district teachers, that were vaccinated with the first-dose of the Moderna Vaccine the week of March 1, 2021, through March 6, 2021.

All individuals are asked to please contact or visit the website of the hospitals listed above for registration information or contact your primary health care doctor's office or pharmacy for vaccine availability and further information.

As per the State of Texas, as of Monday, March 29, 2021, everyone 16 years of age and older is now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. While all vaccines are authorized for people 18 years of age and older, only the Pfizer vaccine is authorized for people 16 years of age and older.

First and second-dose vaccination clinic updates will be provided as allocations are confirmed.
