CAMERON COUNTY TO HOLD SECOND-DOSE VACCINATION CLINIC, ALLOCATE FIRST AND SECOND-DOSE MODERNA VACCINES, AND THE STATE OF TEXAS TO VACCINATE IN THE CITY OF PORT ISABEL

Cameron County Public Health will host a second-dose vaccination clinic on Friday, April 9, 2021, at the Los Fresnos Fire Department for those individuals that were vaccinated with the first-dose of the Moderna Vaccine at the same location on Thursday, March 11, 2021. Individuals are asked to please arrive with your COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card between the hours of 3:00 p.m. through 7:00 p.m.

In collaboration with the State of Texas, 1,000 individuals will be vaccinated at the City of Port Isabel on Wednesday, April 7, 2021. Please contact or visit the website of the City of Port Isabel for more information.

Cameron County Public Health will allocate 6,000 first-dose Moderna Vaccines to the following: Brownsville ISD, City of Brownsville, and the City of Harlingen. The City of Harlingen will host their vaccination clinic on Wednesday, April 7, 2021, followed by the City of Brownsville on Friday, April 9, 2021. Brownsville ISD will host a first-dose vaccination clinic in effort to vaccinate their remaining staff and professionals. All individuals are encouraged to visit the cities website for vaccine availability and registration.

Second-dose Moderna Vaccines have been allocated to the following municipalities: Brownsville, Harlingen, La Feria, Los Fresnos, Los Indios, and Port Isabel.

Cameron County will provide vaccination clinic updates as allocations are confirmed.
