ORDER EXTENDING FOURTEENTH EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER INCLUDING CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEE MASK MANDATE AND REQUIREMENT FOR MEMEBERS OF THE PUBLIC DOING BUSINESS IN COUNTY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO WEAR MASKS

Effective today May 7, 2021, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., has ordered and signed the Order Extending Fourteenth Emergency Management Order Including Cameron County Employee Mask Mandate and Requirement for Members of the Public Doing Business in County Buildings and Facilities to Wear Masks issued and signed on Wednesday, March 10, 2021. This Extension Order will be effective today, Friday, May 7, 2021, at 12:01 p.m. and will continue until Monday, June 7, 2021, at 12:01 p.m. unless extended, modified, or terminated early by the County Judge.

All individuals 10 years or older should continue to utilize a facial covering when in a public place or working in areas that involve close proximity, every business establishment may operate at 100% capacity, all County employees must continue to utilize a facial covering at all times during working hours, and all members of the public doing business in Cameron County buildings and facilities must continue to utilize a facial covering while indoors.
