The 15 cases reported today raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 54,139 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional 23 individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 51,036.

Cameron County Public Health has received notification of two (2) additional COVID-19 related deaths of Cameron County residents. Of these deaths, one was unvaccinated. This raises the total of number of COVID-19 deaths in Cameron County to 2,015.
