Prior to returning your scaled RFQ response / submittal, all Addendums - if issued - should be reviewed and downloaded by entering the County Purchasing web http://www.co.cameron.tx.us/purchasing/specs_notices.htm Addendums Column (updated Addendums). These Addendums must be signed and returned with your RFQ in order to avoid disqualification. All Tabulations can also be viewed and downloaded at this site. Review this document in its entirety. Be sure your RFQ is complete, and double check your RFQ for accuracy. Cameron County is an Equal Employment Opportunity Employer. Review this document in its entirety. I. GENERAL

Cameron County Commissioners Court is requesting Qualification Statements from firms that can adequately demonstrate that they have the resources, experience and qualifications necessary to provide Jail Physician services to: provide medical services and treatment in a timely fashion; ensure that medical services meet county and state jail standards; ensure quality, yet cost effective, medical services; maintain adequate records on medical services, as well as patient profiles; provide quality medical treatment and services to immates confined in the Cameron County Jail Facilities; ensure quality of all medical practices that are undertaken for immates of the Cameron County Jail Facilities; ensure 24 hour medical coverage for immates of the Cameron County Jail Facilities.

It is understood that Cameron County reserves the right to accept or reject any, or all, responses to this RFQ as it shall deem to be in the best interest of Cameron County. Receipt of any Qualification Statements shall be received and acknowledged only so as to avoid disclosure of the contents to competing offerers and kept secret during the negotiation/evaluation process. However, all documentation shall be open for public inspection after a contract is awarded to the extent allowable under the Open Records Act.

The term of contract will be: 3 years with an option to renew for an additional two (2) years subject to Comm. Court approval.

The Request for Qualifications will be evaluated using a point system (100) on the following categories:

- A. Responsiveness to the Request for Technical Qualifications (30)
 - 1. Requested information included and thoroughness of response to the forms included in attachments (if any).
 - 2. Understanding of the services required
 - 3. Creativity of proposed approach to addressing services required
 - 4. Clarity and brevity of the response
- B. Assistant(s) (Key Personnel Plan) (15)
 - 1. Provision for the required disciplines and skills
 - 2. Provision for participation by Physician's key personnel
 - 3. Qualifications for key personnel adequate for requirement
- C. Physician's capability to provide the services (35)
 - 1. Background of the Physician
 - 2. Relevant experience of the Physician
 - 3. Relevant Certificates of the Physician
 - 4. Specific experience on active government services
 - 5. Methodology proposed to meet objectives, responsibilities, duties, and other related services
 - 6. Location in the general geographical area of the services and knowledge of the locality of the services
 - 7. References
- D. Track record of services completed on time and within budget (20)

Once Qualification Statements are reviewed, a short list will be compiled by Commissioners Court. Interviews may be conducted with the firms determined to be most qualified. Additional information may be required at that time. Negotiations will begin with the firm determined to be most qualified for the project. Commissioners Court will make the final selection and approve the proposed contract.

Negotiations will include selection of specific services as in the best interest of Cameron County. The selected firm must be prepared to enter negotiations with each service/project individually represented by costs and necessity to the overall analysis. Cameron County may elect to contract for any, or all, of the proposed services after negotiations.

II. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The intent of solicitation is to obtain the professional pharmacist services of a medical director with demonstrated relevant experience:

Jail Physician's Responsibilities: (Please respond to the following) Section P

1. Direct patient care

- Cover sick call clinic five (5) times per week
- Ensure 24 hour medical coverage
- Physician Services must be provided at Carrizales-Rucker Clinic
- Physician Services must be provided at the (3) Harrison Street Jail / Detention Clinic locations
- Follow-ups for New Patients at all four (4) Clinics
- On call for questions, emergencies, notification of Hospital transport etc. 24 x 7 (7days pr/wk-24 hrs pr/day)
- · Authorize inmate placement into segregation status
- Evaluate dental emergencies and refer to local emergency room or dentist
- Develop individual treatment plans for special needs' population (i.e. chronically ill, physically handicapped, frail elderly, terminally ill, developmentally disabled, those with communicable disease, those who are convelescing)
- Supervise detoxification of inmates

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2. Indirect patient care

- Monitor charts
- · Review results of lab and other diagnostic tests
- Co-signs charts within 72 hours of oral communication with staff
- Identify and refer chemically or alcohol dependent inmates to appropriate services
- Ensure appropriate reportable disease forms submitted county / state health department
- Liaison between all healthcare providers to follow all policies, procedures and the formulary as set by the Cameron County Sheriff's Department
- Collaborate efforts with mental health consultant to develop procedure for handling suicide in progress, including first-aid measures

3. Medical planning

- · Review and sign policies, procedures, and protocols yearly
- Review quarterly Quality Improvement Program for jail health
- · Review monthly Infection Control Program for jail health
- Review quarterly record review performed by nursing staff
- Participate in yearly nurse evaluation
- Active involvement with Director of Nursing and Clinic Supervisor, in Peer Review Process for Nurses, to include:
 - a. Reviewing complaints against nurses
 - b. Reviewing and establishing CEU needs
 - c. Reviewing charting skills
 - d. Reporting finds to Board of Nursing Examiners, if necessary or required
- In conjunction with Nurse Supervisor, ensure nursing protocols are based on protocols of an established professional organization (i.e. American College of Family Practitioners)
- Ensure manual of nursing care is updated annually and is consistent with Texas Nurse Practice Act
- Review and approve all health-related forms
- · Attend, at least quarterly, the monthly jail health facility staff meetings
- Review monthly health reports with Clinic Supervisor and Director of Nursing
 - a. Number of inmates receiving health care services by category
 - b. Referrals to specialists
 - c. Positive testing for HIV and Tuberculosis
 - d. Number of inmates sent to hospital for emergency service (and types of services needed)
 - e. Types of medications prescribed (and costs)
 - f. Types of lab and radiological services ordered
- Ensure that Cameron County Jail Health Policy meets the Texas Department of Jail Certification standards.

III. QUALIFICATIONS' STATEMENTS

Response to this RFQ should be limited to the following maximum page limitations and specified format in order to simplify evaluation. Pages should be 8 1/2 x 11 inches in a point type that is legible and easily read. All sections should be properly identified. Respond to the following:

- A. Executive Summary to include name, address, and telephone number of the firm submitting the RFQ, a summary of the firm's interest in this project, and the name of one or more individuals authorized to represent the consultant in its dealings on a contractual basis. The Executive Summary should also include a statement that indicates if current workload allows for project to be completed on an accelerated schedule. (2 pages)
- B. Names and qualifications of principals and individuals employed by the firm that will participate in these services and their individual responsibilities (10 pages).
- C. Verifiable experience on a similar size and complexity of projects concentrating on the type of services specified herein. Experience should be specific by indicating level of involvement of services completed by you responding to this RFQ and description of services contributed. (10 pages)
- D. Verifiable experience with services for other entities and examples of services to include Name/Location, Owner Representative, Phone Number, and level of involvement by you. (5 pages)
- E. Reference to include contact person, address and phone number (2 pages)
- F. A narrative outline describing the methodology to be taken by the consultant firm discussing any concerns which must be addressed in a project of this nature. The methodology should be specific in firm's ability to stay within budget, and what methods of cost containment are utilized. (5 pages)

Methodology should be specific in approach to:

- 1. cost containment;
- 2. review of plans and providing Cameron County with continuous, update on costs;
- 3. measuring performance against quality, time and cost during design, and implementation phase of the services;
- 4. assist in preparation of contract/documents;
- 5. recommend changes that will result in cost effective solutions;

- 7. coordination of services phase;
- 8. understanding of Guaranteed Maximum Price services to comply with the State of Texas Local Government Code Proposal Requirements and how liabilities, bonds, and insurance are relevant to the scenario in relation to Owner, medical director; and
- 9. What opportunities of economics of scale will be beneficial to Cameron County through coordination of separate projects and the parameters or restrictions involved in taking advantage of this benefit?
- G. A disclosure statement which shall disclose all, potential conflicts of interest related to this project. The disclosure statement must be addressed specifically in your response, even if no conflict exists. (1 page)
- H. You shall disclose any outstanding claims against you (1 page).
- I. You shall include a list of all, current insurance applicable to these services (1 page).
- J. You shall include a sample contract (absent of proposed fees) to demonstrate the contractual relationship between the Owner and medical director.

K. Jail Physician's Qualifications:

- Licensed by State Board of Medical Examiners to practice medicine in Texas
- Current DEA and Department of Public Safety registration certificate for controlled substances
- Board certification in a primary care specialty (i.e. Internal Medicine, Family Practice)
- Self-insured for malpractice at a minimum level of \$100,000 / \$300,000

L. Contract requirements for Jail Physician:

- The use of the awarded Physician's name on the DEA / Texas Controlled Substance License in all (4) Facilities.
- Render services to the jail and detention facilities
- Provide medical consultations, attention and treatment for adult inmates referred for diagnosis and treatment
- Time, dates, amounts, manner and methods of providing services shall be at sole discretion of physician
- Refer inmates, from time to time, to outside facility for additional diagnosis and testing
- Will recommend auxiliary medical personnel to assist medical director
- Will select an additional medical consultant to assist in providing medical advice and care for inmates when medical director is unavailable
- Will not provide medical services for Juvenile Detention Center
- Will update medical protocols, policies, and procedures yearly
- Will not supervise or train auxiliary staff and medical personnel who are employees of Cameron County
- Will not provide psychological evaluation and psychiatric treatment of inmates
- Cannot and will not be responsible for providing treatment outside of jail's facilities
- Will not be responsible for auxiliary personnel working in jail health facilities

M. Cameron County Jail Operation Plan:

- Inmates who, in the opinion of medical staff, are in need of emergency services will be sent to the appropriate facility
- All persons detected, as having communicable disease or other serious medical problem will be isolated and referred
 to local hospital or other medical institution for treatment
- Cameron County Jail will provide emergency medical and dental care in order to provide care for an acute illness or an unexpected health need that cannot be deferred until the next scheduled sick call or clinic
- Sick call will be conducted a minimum of five (5) days per week by a physician and/or other qualified health personnel in a clinical setting

N. Texas Department of Correction Standards:

- See patients in clinic five (5) times per week
- Reviews policies, procedures, protocols
- Monitors charts
- Holds staff meetings and in-services
- Reviews results of lab and other diagnostic tests
- Co-signs charts

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Cameron County, that the following rules be adopted regarding Cameron County and persons interested in doing business with Cameron County:

- Cameron County may refuse to enter into a contract or other transaction with a person with a past due 1. debt to Cameron County, including delinquent ad valorem taxes, even if the person is the lowest bidder or successful proposer; and
- For purposes of this Order, a debt is past due if it is not received in the County Treasurer's Office 2. by the due date in a written agreement or notice, and ad valorem taxes are past due if not received in the County Tax Assessor/Collector's Office by February 1st following the January 1st on which the ad valorem taxes are due.
- For purposes of this Order, a person includes an individual, sole proprietorship, corporation, nonprofit 3. corporation, partnership, joint venture, limited liability company, and any other entity that proposes or otherwise seeks to enter into a contract or other transaction with Cameron County requiring approval by the Commissioners Court.



MAINTENANCE: Maintenance required for equipment RFP/RFQ should be available in Cameron County by a manufacturer authorized maintenance facility. Costs for this service shall be shown on the Pricing/Delivery Information form. If Cameron County opts to include maintenance, it shall be so stated in the purchase order and said cost will be included. Service will commence only upon expiration of applicable warranties and should be priced accordingly.

MATERIAL SAFETY DATA SHEETS: Under the "Hazardous Communication Act", commonly known as the "Texas Right To Know Act", an offeror must provide to the County with each delivery, material safety data sheets which are applicable to hazardous substances defined in the Act. Failure of the offeror to furnish this documentation will be cause to reject any RFP/RFQ applying thereto.

NAME BRANDS: Specifications may reference name brands and model numbers. It is not the intent of Cameron County to restrict these RFP/RFQs in such cases, but to establish a desired quality level of merchandise or to meet a pre-established standard due to like existing items. Offerors may offer items of equal stature and the burden of proof of such stature rests with offerors. Cameron County shall act as sole judge in determining equality and acceptability of products offered.

PRICING: Prices for all goods and/or services shall be firm for the duration of this contract and shall be stated on the Pricing/Delivery Information form. Prices shall be all inclusive: No price changes, additions, or subsequent qualifications will be honored during the course of the contract. All prices must be written in ink or typewritten. Pricing on all transportation, freight, drayage and other charges are to be prepaid by the contractor and included in the RFP/RFQ prices. If there are any additional charges of any kind, other than those mentioned above, specified or unspecified, offeror MUST indicate the items required and attendant costs or forfeit the right to payment for such items. Where unit pricing and extended pricing differ, unit pricing prevails.

RECYCLED MATERIALS: Cameron County encourages the use of products made of recycled materials and shall give preference in purchasing to products made of recycled materials if the products meet applicable specifications as to quantity and quality. County will be the sole judge in determining product preference application.

SCANNED RE-TYPED RESPONSE: If in its RFP/RFQ response, offeror either electronically scans, re-types, or in some way reproduces the County's published RFP/RFQ package, then in event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of the County's published RFP/RFQ specifications, or any portion thereof, and the terms and provisions of the RFP/RFQ response made by offeror, the County's RFP/RFQ specifications as published shall control. Furthermore, if an alteration of any kind to the County's published RFP/RFQ specifications is only discovered after the contract is executed and is or is not being performed, the contract is subject to immediate cancellation.

SILENCE OF SPECIFICATIONS: The apparent silence of specifications as to any detail, or the apparent omission from it of a detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practice is to prevail and that only material and workmanship of the finest quality are to be used. All interpretations of specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement. The items furnished under this contract shall be new, unused of the latest product in production to commercial trade and shall be of the highest quality as to materials used and workmanship. Manufacturer furnishing these items shall be experienced in design and construction of such items and shall be an established supplier of the item RFP/RFQ. Substitute items will not be accepted unless approved (in advance).

SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS: Offerors are responsible for including all pertinent product data in the returned RFP/RFQ package. Literature, brochures, data sheets, specification information, completed forms requested as part of the RFP/RFQ package and any other facts which may affect the evaluation and subsequent contract award should be included. Materials such as legal documents and contractual agreements, which the offeror wishes to include as a condition of the RFP/RFQ, must also be in the returned RFP/RFQ package. Failure to include all necessary and proper supplemental materials may be cause to reject the entire RFP/RFQ.

TITLE TRANSFER: Title and Risk of Loss of goods shall not pass to Cameron Count until Cameron County actually receives and takes possession of the goods at the point or points of delivery. Receiving times may vary with the using department. Generally, deliveries may be made between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Offerors are advised to consult the using department for instructions. The place of delivery shall be shown under the "Special Requirements/Instructions" section of this RFP/RFQ package and/or on the Purchase Order as a "Deliver To:" address.

USAGE REPORTS: Cameron County reserves the right to request, and receive at no additional cost, up to two (2) times during the contract period, a usage report detailing the products and/or services furnished to date under a contract resulting from this RFP. The reports must be furnished no later than five (5) working days after written request and itemize all purchases to date by Cameron County department, description of each item purchased, including manufacturer, quantity of each item purchased, per unit and extended price of each item purchased, and total amount and price of all items purchased.

WARRANTY PRICE: (a) The price to be paid by the Buyer shall be that contained in Seller's bid which Seller warrants to be no higher than Seller's current prices on orders by others for products of the kind and specification covered by this agreement for similar quantities under similar or like conditions and methods of purchase. In the event Seller breaches this warranty, the prices of the items shall be reduced to the Seller's current prices on orders by others, or in the alternative, Buyer may cancel this contract without liability to Seller for breach or Seller's actual expense. (b) The Seller warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee excepting bona fide employees of bona fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Seller for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty, the Buyer shall have the right in addition to any other right or rights to cancel this contract without liability and to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise recover the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee. Offerors shall furnish all data pertinent to warranties or guarantees which may apply to items in the bid. Offerors may not limit or exclude any implied warranties. Offeror warrants that product sold and services provided to the County shall conform to the standards and laws established by the U.S. Department of Labor, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Occupational Safety and Health Administration and O.S.H.A. Act of 1970. In the event product does not conform to OSHA Standards, where applicable, Cameron County may return the product for correction or replacement at the offeror's expense. If offeror fails to make the appropriate correction within a reasonable time, Cameron County may correct at the offeror's expense.

Offerer warrants that product sold and services provided to the County shall conform to the standards and laws established by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Occupational Safety and Health Administration and O.S.H.A. Act of 1970.

WARRANTY PRODUCTS: Seller shall not limit or exclude any implied warranties and any attempt to do so shall render this contract voidable at the option of the Buyer. Seller warrants that the goods furnished will conform to the specifications, drawings and descriptions listed in the RFP/RFQ invitation and to the sample(s) furnished by Seller, if any. In the event of a conflict between the specifications, drawings and descriptions, the specifications shall govern.

SAFETY WARRANTY: Seller warrants that the product sold to Buyer shall conform to the standards promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. In the event the product does not conform to OSHA standards, Buyer may return the product for correction or replacement at the Seller's expense. In the event Seller fails to make the appropriate correction within a reasonable time, correction made by Buyer will be at Seller's expense. APPLICABLE LAW

This agreement shall be governed by the Uniform Commercial Code. Wherever the term "Uniform Commercial Code" is used, it shall be construed as meaning "the Uniform Commercial Code" as adopted in the State of Texas as effective and in force on the date of this agreement.

ASSIGNMENT DELEGATION: No right or interest in this contract shall be assigned or delegation of any obligation made by Seller without the written permission of the Buyer. Any attempted assignment or delegation by Seller shall be wholly void and totally ineffective for all purposes unless made in conformity with this paragraph. Any contract entered into pursuant to this request is not assignable, nor the duties thereunder, by either party, without the written consent of the other party in the contract County Judge and County Auditor.

CONTRACT OBLIGATION: Cameron County Commissioners Court must award the contract and the County Judge or other person authorized by the Cameron County must sign the contract before it becomes binding on Cameron County or the offerors. Department heads are NOT authorized to sign agreements for Cameron County. Binding agreements shall remain in effect until all products and/or services covered by this purchase have been satisfactorily delivered and accepted.

ERRORS AND OMISSIONS: Errors and Omissions in the RFP / RFQ of any provision herein described will not be construed as to relieve the Vendor of any responsibility or obligation, requisite to the complete and satisfactory implementation, operation, and support of any and all equipment, systems or services.

FORCE MAJEURE: If, by reason of Force Majeure, either party hereto shall be rendered unable wholly, or in part, to carry out its obligations under this agreement, then such party shall give notice and full particulars of Force Majeure in writing to the other party within a reasonable time after occurrence of the event or cause relied upon, and the obligation of the party giving such notice, so far as it is affected by such Force Majeure, shall be suspended during the continuance of the inability then claimed, except as hereinafter provided, but for no longer period, and such party shall endeavor to remove or overcome such inability with all reasonable dispatch. The term "Force Majeure" as employed herein, shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, act of public enemy, orders of any kind of government of the United States or the State of Texas or any civil or military authority, insurrections, riots, epidemics, landslides, lightening, earthquakes, fires, hurricanes, storms, floods, washouts, droughts, arrests, restraint of government and people, civil disturbances, explosions, breakage or accidents to machinery, pipelines or canals, or other causes not reasonably within the control of the party claiming such inability. It is understood and agreed that the settlement of strikes and lockouts shall be entirely with the discretion of the party having the difficulty, and that the above requirement that any Force Majeure shall be remedied with all reasonable dispatch shall not require the settlement of strikes and lockouts by acceding to the demands of the opposing party or parties when such settlement is unfavorable in the judgement of the party having the difficulty.

HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT: Contractor, the successful offeror, shall indemnify and hold Cameron County harmless from all claims for personal injury, death and/or property damage resulting directly or indirectly from contractor's performance. Contractor shall procure and maintain, with respect to the subject matter of this RFP/RFQ, appropriate insurance coverage including, as a minimum, public liability and property damage with adequate limits to cover contractor's liability as may arise directly or indirectly from work performed under terms of this RFP/RFQ. Certification of such coverage must be provided to the County upon request.

INFRINGEMENTS: There will be no warranty by buyer against infringements. As part of this contract for sales, Seller agrees to ascertain whether goods manufactured in accordance with the specifications attached to this agreement will give rise to the rightful claim of any third person by way of infringement or the like. Buyer makes no warranty that the production of goods according to the specification will not give rise to such a claim, and in no event shall Buyer be liable to Seller for indemnification in the event that Seller is sued on the grounds of infringement or the like. If Seller is of the opinion that an infringement or the like will result, he will notify Buyer to this effect in writing within two (2) weeks after the signing of this agreement. If Buyer does not receive notice and is subsequently held liable for the infringement or the like, Seller will hold Buyer harmless. If Seller in good faith ascertains that production of the goods in accordance with the specifications will result in infringement or the like, this contract shall be null and void, except that Buyer will pay Seller the reasonable cost of his/her search as to infringement. The contractor agrees to protect the County from claims involving infringement of patents or copyrights.

INTERPRETATION PAROLE EVIDENCE: This writing is intended by the parties as a final expression of their agreement and is intended also as a complete and exclusive statement of the terms of their agreement. No course of prior dealings between the parties and no usage of the trade shall be relevant to supplement or explain any term used in the agreement. Acceptance or acquiescence in a course of performance rendered under this agreement shall not be relevant to determine the meaning of this agreement, even though the accepting or acquiescing party has knowledge of the performance and opportunity for objection. Whenever a term defined by the Uniform Commercial Code is used in this agreement, the definition contained in the Code is to Control.

MODIFICATIONS: This contract can be modified or rescinded only by a writing signed by both of the parties or their duly authorized agents. O.S.H.A: Offeror must meet all Federal and State OSHA requirements.

RIGHT TO ASSURANCE: Whenever one (1) party to this contract in good faith has reason to question the other party's intent to perform, he/she may demand that the other party give written assurance of their intent to perform. In the event that a demand is made, and no assurance is given within five (5) days the demanding party may treat this failure as an anticipatory repudiation of the contract.

SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of these requirements or the specifications shall be held invalid, such holding shall not affect the remaining portions of these requirements and the specifications and it is hereby declared that such remaining portions would have been included in these requirements and the specifications as though the invalid portion had been omitted.

VENUE: Both parties agree that venue for any litigation arising from this contract shall lie in Cameron County, Texas.
