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The meeting was called to order by Judge Antonio O. Garza, Jr. He then asked Ms. Dylbia Jefferies, County Counsel, to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

## (1) APPROVAL OF COUNTY CLAIMS

#### IN THE MATTER OF BUDGET AMENDMENTS (2) AND/OR SALARY SCHEDULES (NO ACTION TAKEN)

The Budget Officer noted that there were no Budget Amendments and/or Salary Schedules for approval at this

time.

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#### (3) **APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF OCTOBER 19, 1993**

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the

Minutes of the Regular Meeting held October 19, 1993, at 1:30 P. M. were approved.

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#### AUTHORIZATION OF REQUEST BY HARLINGEN (4) PUBLIC LIBRARY TO WITHDRAW FROM THE **CAMERON COUNTY LIBRARY SYSTEM**

At this time, Mr. Maurice Tsai, Library Director, stated that the Harlingen City Commission approved the

withdrawal of the Harlingen Library from the Cameron County Library System, effective October 1, 1993, but that the

by-laws required that a six (6) month prior notice be given, and he requested said waiver be granted.

Commissioner Cascos questioned the by-law requirements for the "six-month prior notice" and asked whether

the City of Harlingen had complied with the requirement to publish the Notices in the newspaper.

Mr. Tsai responded that the Notices had been published for six (6) weeks and that no comments had been

received.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, the Harlingen Public Library withdrawal from the Cameron County Library System and the support of the waiver of the six (6) month period were approved.

#### IN THE MATTER OF FINAL INVOICE FROM THE **REVENUE MARKETS, INC. (TABLED)**

Mr. Joe Galvan, Bridge Systems Director, explained that the invoice in the amount of \$26,626.40 from The Revenue Market, Inc., concerned work previously done to the Electronic Toll Collection System at Gateway International Bridge and the Los Indios Free Trade Bridge.

He explained that Mr. Jack Brown, Project Engineer, had held the payment to the final invoice until he was satisfied with the operation of the equipment, and added that he was also satisfied and recommended payment.

Mr. Galvan stated that he was not aware of the outstanding invoice and added that the amount of \$26,626.40 was not budgeted and he suggested that the amount of \$5,500.00 for the work done at Gateway International Bridge be allocated from the Gateway Budget, and the amount of \$21,123.00 be allocated from the Free Trade Bridge Construction Fund.

There was some discussion concerning the outstanding amount not being in the Budget and whether the work was satisfactorily completed and the suggestion was made to table the matter for one (1) week.

Upon motion by Commissioner Rosenbaum, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, this Item was TABLED for one (1) week.

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#### (6) IN THE MATTER TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL GRANT FOR MORE DEPUTIES (TABLED)

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, this Item

was TABLED for one (1) week.

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#### (7) AUTHORIZATION TO AWARD BIDS FOR CAMERON COUNTY JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITY

Mr. Chuck Croslin, Architect with the Firm of Cox-Croslin, Austin, Texas, recommended that Scoggins

Construction, Harlingen, Texas, be awarded the Contract for the Cameron County Juvenile Facility Project in the amount

of \$2,942,194.00. He recommended several alternate changes and added that Change Order No. 1 would be issued prior

to signing the Contract.

Commissioner Cascos moved that Scoggins Construction, Harlingen, Texas, be awarded the Contract for the

Cameron County Juvenile Detention Facility, in the amount of \$2,942,194.00, along terms as outlined by the Consulting

Architect, and as reviewed by the Juvenile Detention Center Director and the Budget Officer.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

At this time, Mr. Amador Rodriguez, Chief Juvenile Probation Officer, on behalf of the Chairman of the

Juvenile Board, thanked the Court for their support and for the assistance provided by the Budget Officer.

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## (8) AUTHORIZATION FOR THE TAX ASSESSOR COLLECTOR TO EXTEND THE TAX DISCOUNT AN ADDITIONAL TWO (2) WEEKS

Mr. Felix Munoz, First Assistant and Chief Deputy County Tax Assessor-Collector, explained that the printers

in San Antonio encountered difficulties in reading the tapes that were sent on October 4, 1993, and were only able to mail

out approximately eighty-five percent (85%) of the Tax Statements by October 15, 1993. He explained that the

remaining Tax Statements were mailed after October 21, 1993 and the Tax Assessor Collector's Office requested that the

"tax discounts" be extended an additional two (2) weeks.

Commissioner Rosenbaum moved that the Tax Assessor Collector be authorized to extend the "tax discounts" an

additional two (2) weeks.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously.

intention was to discuss the pending investigation with respect to the Cameron County International Bridge System and that subsequently, a lawsuit, styled any number of employees versus Cameron County, was filed, and added that both

matters would be discussed in Executive Session.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Court reconvened in Regular Session at 3:45 P.M.

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#### (20) ACTION RELATIVE TO EXECUTIVE SESSION

a) Action regarding discussion on contemplated or potential litigation with respect to Cameron County International Bridge System.

Judge Garza reported that, as previously stated, the Executive Session discussion included the status of the current investigation with respect to the International Bridge System and the now pending litigation, styled Nicho Galvan, et. al. versus Cameron County, et. al., and called on the District Attorney for a Report.

At this time, Mr. Luis Saenz, District Attorney, recommended that the Item be placed on the next Agenda for further discussion.

Judge Garza noted that on the recommendation of the District Attorney, as well as the consensus of the Court as determined by polling, the Item would be placed on the Agenda one (1) week hence for additional discussion and, hopefully, some decision at that time.

Upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Rosenbaum and carried unanimously, the matter concerning the contemplated or potential litigation with respect to the Cameron County International Bridge System would be placed on the Agenda one (1) week hence for further discussion.

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There being no further business to come before the Court, upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by

Commissioner Rosenbaum and carried unanimously, the meeting was adjourned.
