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The meeting was called to order by Judge Hinojosa. He then asked Pastor Juan J. Morales, Iglesia En La Roca, for the invocation, and the entire Court lead the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on March 17, 1995, at 8:39 A. M.:

(1) APPROVAL OF THE COUNTY CLAIMS

At this time, Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, highlighted the following Vehicle and Equipment List in the Road and Bridge Fund, and the Auditor's Recommendations on the Equipment Requests by the various Departments, to be funded by the General Fund:

At this time, Commissioner Matz reminded the County Auditor of the request for a Mid-Year Budget Review and the County Auditor responded that the Report reflecting the expenditures would be provided.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the County Claims were approved as recommended by the County Auditor.

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(2) BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND/OR SALARY

SCHEDULES

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the Fiscal Year 1995 Budget Amendment No. 95-15, and the Salary Schedule for the Maternal & Child Health Department, Fund No. 27-629, were approved as recommended by the County Auditor.

The Budget Amendment and Salary Schedule are as follow:

(3) IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES [PASSED]

The Deputy County Clerk reported that there were no Minutes for approval at this time.

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(4) AUTHORIZATION TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR THE LEASE PURCHASE OF ROAD AND BRIDGE EQUIPMENT

Commissioner Matz moved that advertisement for bids for the Lease Purchase of Road and Bridge Equipment be approved.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously.

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(5) APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION DECLARING MARCH 28, 1995, AS "MR. ROBERTO RIVERA DAY"

At this time, Mr. Kenneth Conway, Parks Systems Director, recognized Mr. Roberto Rivera, Cameron County Parks System Equipment Operator, for the forty (40) years of service to Cameron County and recommended that March 28, 1995, be designated as "Roberto Rivera Day" in Cameron County.

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Resolution honoring Mr. Roberto Rivera, Cameron County Parks System Equipment Operator, be adopted on the occasion of his retirement, and that March 28, 1995, be proclaimed as "Roberto Rivera Day" in Cameron County.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously.

The Resolution is as follows:

(6) ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION HONORING MS. GLORIA M. GONZALEZ, DEPUTY COUNTY CLERK, ON THE OCCASION OF HER RETIREMENT, AND PROCLAIMING MARCH 31, 1995, AS "GLORIA M. GONZALEZ DAY" IN CAMERON COUNTRY

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, the Resolution honoring Ms. Gloria Gonzalez, Deputy County Clerk, was adopted, on the occasion of her retirement, and March 31, 1995, was proclaimed as "Gloria M. Gonzalez Day" in Cameron County.

At this time, Mr. Joe G. Rivera, County Clerk, stated that the Resolution would be presented at a Reception scheduled for March 31, 1995, at the Central Jury Room.

The Resolution is as follows:

(7) IN THE MATTER OF APPROVAL FOR A NEW

POSITION AS ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT FOR

JUSTICE OF THE PEACE ED SARABIA [TABLED]

Judge Hinojosa clarified that Judge Ed Sarabia, Justice of the Peace, Precinct No. 2 Place No. 2, was not requesting an Administrative Assistant, but rather was trying to equalize the discrepancies between the salaries of the Court Clerk with that of the adjacent Court Clerk, and questioned whether action could be taken due to the wording of the Agenda Item, and the suggestion was made to table the matter and to place it back on the Agenda with the correct wording.

Commissioner Matz questioned the amount of the increase and Judge Hinojosa responded that the difference in salary was \$3,000.00, and the suggestion was made that the request should be submitted during the Budget Review Process or the Mid-Year Budget Review.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, this Item was **TABLED** for one (1) week.

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(8) AUTHORIZATION TO PAY \$2,440.00 FROM THE CONTINGENCY FUND, THE MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR THE COUNTY TO THE TEXAS ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES

Commissioner Matz moved that the amount of \$2,440.00, from the Contingency Fund, be allocated for the Texas Association of Counties Membership dues.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously.

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(9) AUTHORIZATION OF MR. REMI GARZA, EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO THE COUNTY JUDGE, AS THE COUNTY JUDGE'S DESIGNEE TO THE CAMERON COUNTY BAIL BOND BOARD

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, Mr. Remi Garza, Executive Assistant to the County Judge, was appointed to the Cameron County Bail Bond Board.

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(10) APPROVAL TO APPOINT MR. RENE TORRES, BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS, TO THE CAMERON COUNTY CHILD WELFARE BOARD

Upon motion by Commissioner Peña, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, Mr. Rene Torres, Brownsville, Texas, was appointed to the Cameron County Child Welfare Board..

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
(11) AUTHORIZATION TO APPROVE THE OFFICIAL BONDS AND OATHS FOR MR. SAM SATO, MR. HOWARD B. GIRAULT, AND MR. H. B. HILL, FOR NEW TERMS AS COMMISSIONERS DIRECTORS OF CAMERON COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 1

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the Official Bonds and Oaths of Office for Mr. Sam Sato, Mr. Howard B. Girault, and Mr. H.B. Hill, as Commissioners Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 1, were approved, subject to Legal Review.

(13) IN THE MATTER OF THE CONTRACT WITH METRO-SEARCH DIGITAL DATA-BASE TO PURCHASE CD-ROM PRODUCT [TABLED]

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, this Item was TABLED.

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(14) AUTHORIZATION FOR THE CAMERON COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH MATERNAL AND CHILD PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 1996

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, the Cameron County Health Department was authorized to submit an Application for funding under the Texas Department of Health Maternal and Child Program for Fiscal Year 1996.

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(15) AUTHORIZATION FOR THE TAX ASSESSOR COLLECTOR TO CONNECT ONE (1) CAMERON COUNTY TITLE COMPANY TO THE COUNTY COMPUTER TAX SYSTEM AS A PILOT PROJECT AND EVENTUALLY CONNECT ALL TITLE COMPANIES TO THE SYSTEM

Mr. Tony Yzaguirre, Cameron County Tax Office Director, explained that the thirty (30) day "Pilot" Program would provide one (1) Title Company to be on-line with the County, in order for the Title Company to be able to retrieve Tax information more rapidly and efficiently. He stated that the on-line Project would eliminate staff time spent on the telephone and the Title Companies would pay for the services. Mr. Yzaguirre added that once the "Pilot" Program was operational, the other Title Companies would be on-line.

At this time, the following Title Company representatives expressed their approval for the "Pilot" Program:

Mr. John White, Rio Grande Valley Abstract Title Company;

Mr. William Faulk Sr., Cameron County Title Company; and

Mr. Guy Hudleston, Southern Texas Title Company.

At this time, Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, stated that the new System would save the County thousands of calls each month and would ease some on the burden of the County employees. Mr. Yates stated that a similar Project

Proposal was being considered for the District Clerk's and the County Clerk's Imaging System, and added that the cost to the contracting Companies would be about \$125.00, per month.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, the Tax Assessor Collector's Office was authorized to connect with one (1) Title Company to the County Computer Tax System as a "Pilot" Project and eventually to connect all Title Companies to the System.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, County Counsel was directed to proceed along the terms and conditions as outlined in Executive Session regarding a) Rojano vs. Cameron County, Civil Action No. B-94-048; b) Balderas vs. Cameron County, et al, C-1181-95-E; and c) Garcia vs. Cameron County, 93-07-2953-C.

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There being no further business to come before the Court, upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, the meeting was adjourned.
