(1) WORKSHOP TO DISCUSS THE CAMERON COUNTY CONSTABLES

At this time, Ms. Grace Salinas, Assistant Administrator, highlighted the following Report concerning the

Constables' precinct population, organization, costs and workload:

After some discussion concerning the disparity in population and workload, the following Constables

presented a brief Report concerning their functions and responsibilities:

- Constable Mike Barberena, Precinct No. 1
- Constable Arturo Gonzalez, Precinct No. 2
- Constable Juan Jose Sanchez, Precinct No. 3
- Constable Robert Lopez, Precinct No. 4
- Constable Javier Loredo, Precinct No. 5
- Constable Carlos Z. Gracia, Precinct No. 6, and
- Constable Juan Mendoza, Precinct No. 8.

Mr. Doug Wright, County Counsel, explained the statutory and Constitutional Requirements concerning the

Constables and added that the State Statutes provided for eight (8) Constables based on the population of the County,

but that the Court had the discretion as to the number of Constables and the area to be served. He added that more than

one (1) Justice of the Peace could serve in a Constable's Precinct, but only one Constable per Precinct.

The following individuals expressed their concerns regarding the Constable's responsibilities and population

served:

- Mr. Eddie Medrano, Attorney At Law.

(2) EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously, the Court

met in Executive Session at 11:10 A. M. to discuss the following matter:

a) To confer with County Counsel to discuss the Cameron County Constables.

(3) ACTION RELATIVE TO EXECUTIVE SESSION

a) To discuss matters pertaining to the Cameron County Constables.

Mr. Doug Wright, County Counsel, reported that after some discussion, it was the consensus of the Court as determined by polling, that the Court would provide direction to the Constables to insure compliance with the statutory requirements, and to establish a date for a Public Hearing concerning said matter.

by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the meeting was ADJOURNED.
