The meeting was called to order by Judge Gilberto Hinojosa. He then asked Mr. Bob Clark, Brownsville resident, for the invocation and Commissioner Cascos to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on November 17, 1995, at 9:46 A. M.:

(1) APPROVAL OF COUNTY CLAIMS

At this time, Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, stated that Warrant No. 002200, payable to Metal Creations, in the amount of \$7,500.00, was pending resolution of the problems with the design and installation of the metal overhang at the Precinct No. 4 Fuel Pump Site and added that once the issues were resolved payment would be made and recommended approval of the claims.
