The meeting was called to order by Judge Gilberto Hinojosa. The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on August 21, 1996, at 11:16 A.M.:

## (1) AUTHORIZATION TO MAKE EMERGENCY PURCHASES OF COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT, PUBLIC SAFETY EQUIPMENT, AND PROTECTIVE GEAR AND CLOTHING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS AND EMERGENCY PERSONNEL

At this time, Judge Hinojosa stated that Hurricane Dolly appeared to be diminishing, but added that the County should still take precautions and purchase the necessary equipment in order to be prepared, such as satellite phones for each of the Precincts.

Commissioner Cascos stated that Mr. Lee Thompson, Code 3, had volunteered his mobile unit and offered ten

(10) to fifteen (15) satellite phones that would be loaned to the County, at no charge.

Judge Hinojosa recommended to purchase three (3) satellite phones and added that generators would be set

aside by the rental companies for the County's use.

Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, stated that the Auditor's Office had purchased two (2) generators due to the weakness in the fueling system.

There was some discussion concerning the existing Protective Gear and Clothing, and the recommendation was made that an estimated number of twenty (20) raincoats and rubber boots should be purchased. Judge Hinojosa noted that ten thousand sand bags were purchased and would be distributed among the Precincts.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Rosenbaum and carried unanimously, the purchases of three (3) satellite phones, two (2) generators, Public Safety Equipment, and Protective Gear and Clothing for Law Enforcement Officials and Emergency Personnel, were approved.

Commissioner Peña stated that the County should also consider the rental of pumps in the case of flooding for

drainage purposes.

Commissioner Matz noted that Code 3 had offered the pumps to the County.

## (2) AUTHORIZATION FOR THE COUNTY JUDGE TO ACT AS A SIGNATORY AND/OR DECISION AUTHORITY ON BEHALF OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT DURING THE STORM EMERGENCY

Commissioner Matz moved that the County Judge be authorized to act as a signatory and/or decision authority

on behalf of the Commissioners' Court during the Storm Emergency.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Peña and carried unanimously.

## (3) EMERGENCY NOTICE UNDER SECTION 551.045 OF THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT

At this time, Mr. Doug Wright, Cameron County Counsel, explained that the Court was required to declare that the conditions to public health and safety, as a result of the National Weather Service Projection of the storm effect on Cameron County by the storm

Upon motion by Commissioner Rosenbaum, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the Emergency Notice approved.

At this time, Judge Hinojosa noted that the main concern was the evacuation of the Mobile Trailers from South Padre Island, F the Parks System Director reported that there were seven-hundred and fifty trailers in the areas.

There being no further business to come before the Court, upon motion by Commissioner Rosenbaum, seconded by Commissi ADJOURNED.
