ABSENT:

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The meeting was called to order by Judge Gilberto Hinojosa at 10:05 A.M. He then asked Mr. Bob Clark, Brownsville resident, for the invocation and Commissioner Cascos to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on April 1, 1999, at 2:36 P.M.:

**(1) APPROVAL OF COUNTY CLAIMS**

At this time, Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, presented the following late claim as to Warrant No. 11428, payable to Comptroller of Public Accounts, in the amount of \$2,195.00.

Commissioner Matz expressed concern as to Warrant No. 11277, in the amount of \$169.00, for the purchase of five hundred pages with letterhead, noting that each page had cost 33.8 cents which was rather high.

Mr. Yates explained that the purchase was allocated from the Drug Forfeiture Funds, Fund No. 90, and stated that the Departments which had access to personal computers, were encouraged to utilize the letterhead electronically generated with each correspondence, in order to avoid the additional costs.

Commissioner Matz expressed concern as to the high number of payments being made to Court Appointed Attorneys in the check register and Mr. Yates responded that the Warrants consisted of County Court, District Court and individually assigned Court Appointed Attorneys.

Commissioner Cascos referred to the Warrant payable to La Frontera Materials for caliche and questioned why caliche was being utilized more than limestone, which was more durable than caliche.

Mr. Juan Bernal, County Engineer, explained that limestone had been utilized on the roads in the Cameron Park Subdivision and added that the caliche was being utilized until the determination was made as to the durability of the limestone roads in Cameron Park.

Commissioner Cascos stated that a presentation had been made by the previous County Engineer on the durability of limestone on the roads which would save the County money in the long run, as opposed to utilizing caliche and recommended that the County utilize limestone on the roads. He expressed concern as to the payment to Dr. Paul A. Lenz for a contractual expense, noting that the County did not have a Contract with Dr. Lenz.

Mr. Yates explained that the payment was reported as a contractual expense category and noted that the Dr. Lenz was providing services on a month-to-month basis, adding that a Contract had been submitted to the County Judges Office to be placed on the Agenda for consideration by the Court.

Judge Hinojosa stated that the Item had not been placed on the Agenda because it was his understanding that Dr. Lenz would provide the services on a month-to-month basis until the Contract was advertised for Bids and added that the Contract was not a temporary Contract.

Commissioner Cascos explained that the term of the Contract consisted of one (1) year with a forty-five (45) day out clause and suggested that the Jail Physician Contract be advertised.

Mr. Yates stated that the Gatekeeper Contract for the Indigent Health Care Program had been advertised and reported that a proposal had been made for five (5) medical clinics to act as the Gatekeeper, noting that the County

preferred an individual to provide the Gatekeeper Services. He suggested that the County should defer the matter until after the Legislative Session which might significantly change the Indigent Health Care Program and added that there was a proposal for the creation of a Valley-wide Health Services Delivery District to be implemented in the next two (2) years.

Judge Hinojosa suggested that the Request for Proposals be advertised for the Jail Physician Contract and that a Workshop be scheduled to discuss the operations of the project.

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to Warrant No. 11238, payable to Arturo Gomez, for Contract expense and Mr. Yates responded that the Warrant was paid through the District Attorney's Office Drug Enforcement Task-Force, noting that the matter would be researched to determine whether the Contract had been approved by the Court.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the County Claims were approved, as presented by the County Auditor, inclusive of the late claim as to Warrant No. 11428, in the amount of \$2,195.00.



(2) **APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND/OR SALARY SCHEDULES**

At this time, Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, presented a letter from the County Clerk requesting expenditure of funds to be allocated from the Reserve Balances in the Records Management Fund.

Judge Hinojosa stated that the matter which was within the guidelines of the Personnel Committee, had been discussed with Mr. Joe G. Rivera, County Clerk, and added that the request had not been formerly presented to the Personnel Committee, noting that Commissioner Cascos had resigned from the Committee and Commissioner Benavides would be the replacement.

Mr. Yates stated that the Personnel Committee created a floodgate of requests all at once and suggested that the Court could resume to the prior practice of addressing the items individually as they were presented to the Court throughout the year.

Judge Hinojosa stated that handling the requests once a year was preferred as opposed to individual requests throughout the year and added that the Personnel Committee controlled the use of the Lapsed Salaries Fund. He suggested that the County Clerk's request be deferred until after the Personnel Committee Meeting.

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to the budget increase of equipment for the Gateway International Bridge, from \$12,000.00 to \$118,500.00.

Mr. Yates clarified that the increase was a transfer from Gateway International Bridge to the Los Tomates International Bridge and explained that the increase for the equipment was a budgetary loan from Gateway to the Los Tomates Bridge which would be repaid by Los Tomates Bridge.

Commissioner Matz moved that the 1999 Fiscal Year Budget Amendment No. 99-24 be approved.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

**The Letter and the Budget Amendments are as follow:**

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, this Item was **TABLED**.

**(4) ADOPTION OF A PROCLAMATION  
DECLARING THE MONTH OF APRIL 1999 AS  
SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN  
CAMERON COUNTY**

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Proclamation declaring the Month of April 1999 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Cameron County be adopted.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously.

(5) **PRESENTATION AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE SUMMARY OF MONTHLY REPORTS FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1999**

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to the timeliness of the Reports by the Elected Officials being submitted to the County Treasurer and the County Auditor's Office and as to the penalties concerning the tardiness of reports to the State.

Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, stated that the Court had been provided with a list of Elected Officials' reports which were required by Statute and reported that the Justice of the Peace Offices did not submit their Reports in a timely manner, due to the volume in work.

Mr. Eddie A. Gonzalez, County Treasurer, explained that the County was fined a certain amount for the funds not returned to the State and that the County was required to forfeit any funds detained.

Commissioner Cascos requested that the Court should be advised regarding the tardiness of the Reports by the Elected Officials to the County Auditor and County Treasurer's Office.

At this time, there was some discussion regarding the Rio Hondo Justice of the Peace holding other positions with other municipalities and Judge Hinojosa stated that if the Rio Hondo Justice of the Peace was operating a full-time position, the salary should be re-examined.

Commissioner Matz moved that the presentation of the summary of monthly reports for the first quarter of the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, be acknowledged.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Commissioner Benavides, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Resolution was adopted authorizing the Tax Assessor-Collector to request one additional Registration and Title Workstation (RTS) from the Texas Department of Transportation Vehicle Titles and Registration Division for the additional drive-up window in Brownsville, Texas.

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Amendment to Contract between Cameron County and H.E.B. Grocery Stores be approved to include H.E.B. No. 5, located at 2155 Paredes Line Road in Brownsville, Texas, for issuance of automobile renewal license stickers in Cameron County, Texas.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Commissioner Benavides, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Resolution was adopted authorizing the submission of a Grant Application to the 1999 Texas Community Development Program Colonia Area Planning Fund, on behalf of Colonia La Torre in Cameron County, and authorizing the County Judge to act in all matters pertaining to said application.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Resolution was adopted authorizing the submission of a Grant Application to the 1999 Texas Community Development Program Step, on behalf of the Arroyo Colorado Estates in Cameron County, and the County Judge was authorized to act in all matters pertaining to said application.

At this time, Judge Hinojosa questioned the procedures of said Project and Mr. Frank Bejarano, Planning Development and Management Director, responded that the Grant was for a self-help project for said subdivision.

Mr. Bejarano explained that an individual, hired by the neighborhood, installed the main lines for water and sewer and noted that the Grant was requested to assist with the purchase of equipment, supplies and technical assistance.

Judge Hinojosa reported that Dimmett County was currently working on a Project in a certain area with the United States Marines Engineering Division, whereas the County allocated the funds for the pipes and the Marines Engineering Division installed the trench and water lines. He stated that Cameron County should consider the same type of Project at Kopernik Shores Subdivision.

Mr. Bejarano noted that Kopernik Shores Subdivision was not designated as a Colonia and added that the process could not begin until the appropriate information was received from residents of said subdivision.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Public Hearing to abandon Dennis Lane within Precinct No. 4 was opened for public comment.

Hearing and sensing no further comments, upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, the Public Hearing was closed.

(20) **IN THE MATTER OF CHANGE ORDER NO. 6  
FOR THE LOS TOMATES TOLL AND  
ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (TABLED)**

At this time, Mr. Juan Bernal, County Engineer, stated that the Firm of Kell Muñoz Wigodsky, Incorporated, had requested that the County Engineer-s recommendation for the firm to incur the costs of additional work to be performed on the Toll Booths at the Los Tomates Bridge be reviewed, noting that his recommendation had not changed.

Mr. Benito Polendo, Kell Muñoz Wigodsky, Incorporated, explained that the Contractor had advised the architect firm during the construction phase, that the toll booths would have to be redesigned to accommodate the air condition units. He stated that an initial cost of the additional construction, in the amount of \$15,286.00, had been proposed to the architectural firm, but noted that a second cost estimate had been requested and resulted in an amount of \$6,710.00, which was less than half the initial cost. Mr. Polendo stated that there was a contingency allowance for the project, in the amount of \$35,000.00, for unknown and unforeseen issues.

Commissioner Cascos suggested that the cost of the toll booth roofs be deferred until after the Project was completed and added that if there were no more contingencies over the \$35,000.00 at the end of the Project, the County would pay the costs to the toll booths. He stated that if there were any contingencies that exceeded the amount of \$35,000.00, Kell Muñoz Wigodsky, Incorporated, would incur the costs for the toll booth roofs.

Commissioner Matz noted that there would be additional costs for the equipment to complete the reflection pond at the Los Tomates International Bridge which was not included in the original design.

At this time, Commissioner Valencia stated that the costs of the toll booth roofs should be paid by the County before the Project is completed, in order to proceed with the completion of the Project.

Commissioner Valencia moved that the costs of the Los Tomates International Bridge toll booth roofs, in the amount of \$6,710.00, be paid by the County before the project completion date.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and the vote is as follows:
