Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, recommended that the negotiations of the equipment rental should be conducted prior to a hurricane occurring, noting that the availability of the equipment was imperative.

Judge Hinojosa suggested that the existing equipment should be assessed, in order to determine the necessary equipment for said project and added that the funds should be acquired from the Bond Markets to update the equipment in the Public Works Department.
