ABSENT:

The meeting was called to order by Judge Hinojosa at 9:42 A.M. He then asked Mr. Bob Clark, Brownsville resident, for the invocation and Commissioner Cascos to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on September 17, 1999, at 9:40 A.M., and the Supplemental Notice posted on September 17, 1999, at 2:52 P.M.:

(1) APPROVAL OF COUNTY CLAIMS

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to Warrant No. 19442, payable to Joe King, Jr. Printer, Incorporated, concerning the purchase of business cards for the Tax Assessor-Collector and stated that business cards and resolutions should be printed in-house.

Commissioner Benavides noted that an experienced printer should be hired to assist the Reproduction Director, due to the excess amount of work at the print shop and added that it would eliminate the need for outside printers.

Judge Hinojosa suggested that a Memorandum be sent to all Departments reflecting that the County would not fund printing services, other than the County's Reproduction Center, unless the printing request was pre-approved before being printed by an outside entity.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the County Claims were approved, as presented by the County Auditor.



(2) APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND/OR SALARY SCHEDULES

At this time, there was a lengthy discussion as to the process of increasing slots in the Planning and Inspection and the Road and Bridge Departments and the suggestion was made to table said Salary Schedules.

Commissioner Valencia moved that the 1999 Fiscal Year Budget Amendment No. 99-45, and the Schedules for SPEED, Fund No. 210-4600, be approved.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously.

The Budget Amendments and the Salary Schedules are as follow:

(3) IN THE MATTER OF MINUTES FOR THE MEETING OF AUGUST 31, 1999, REGULAR MEETING (NO ACTION TAKEN)



(4) ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF REPORT BY THE PROPERTY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR AND BUILDING SUPERINTENDENT ON THE STATUS OF THE CAMERON COUNTY AIRPORT HANGAR

At this time, Mr. Joseph Ardito, Property Management Coordinator, explained the condition of the hangar's roof as a result from the latest storm and noted that the Building Superintendent had inspected the building to confirm the roof's condition.

Mr. Roger Ortiz, Building Superintendent, briefly highlighted the damages and repairs to be made, noting that the cost of the repairs was approximately \$12,830.00.

Judge Hinojosa expressed concern as to whether the building was worth the amount of funds to be allocated by the County for repairs and suggested that the property should be sold or developed by the County.

Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, noted that the County had accepted grant funding for improvements to the airport, contingent upon maintaining a County Airport and added that the grant should be rejected if the County was not going to improve the building.

Mr. Ardito noted that there was a month-to-month Lease Agreement of the airport with the County and Southwind Airlines.

Commissioner Cascos recommended that County Counsel should review and discuss the Agreement with the Concessionaires and added that the contractual obligations should be reviewed.

At this time, there was some discussion as to the utilization of the airport and the suggestion was made to place the Item on the next week's Executive Session.

Upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, the Report by the Property Management Coordinator and the Building Superintendent, on the status of the Cameron County Airport hanger, was acknowledged.



**(5) APPROVAL FOR THE COUNTY CLERK-S OFFICE
FEE SCHEDULE EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 1999**

At this time, Mr. Joe G. Rivera, County Clerk, highlighted the fees collected which were sent to the State of Texas and those fees remained in the County, including the Law Library fees, noting that the increase in fees were mandated by the State.

Commissioner Cascos moved that the County Clerk-s Office Fee Schedule, effective October 1, 1999, be approved.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously.

The Fee Schedule is as follows:

(6) AUTHORIZATION TO UTILIZE COUNTY EQUIPMENT FROM THE JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE TEXAS PROBATION ASSOCIATION-S 1999 LEGISLATIVE ANNUAL CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, ON OCTOBER 20, 1999, THROUGH NOVEMBER 3, 1999

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Juvenile Probation Department utilize County equipment for the Texas Probation Association-s 1999 Legislative Annual Conference to be held in South Padre Island, Texas, on October 20, 1999, through November 3, 1999.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

(7) ACTION ON PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW FOR THE SELECTION OF THE DESIGN/BUILD COMPANY FOR THE NEW COUNTY JAIL AND SHERIFF-S OFFICE

At this time, Judge Hinojosa suggested that the four (4) Design/Build Companies selected by the Selection Committee, present their proposals to the Court.

Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to the process to ensure the quality of the products being utilized and Judge Hinojosa replied that every aspect of the construction, including the materials would be negotiated with the selected firm.

Commissioner Benavides moved that the four (4) selected Design/Build Companies present their proposals to the Commissioners- Court on October 3, 1999.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

(8) IN THE MATTER OF THE NEXT PHASE OF THE VALLE HERMOSO/VALLE ESCONDIDO DRAINAGE DITCH FROM FM/1419 TO THE MAIN DRAINAGE DITCH (TABLED)

At this time, Mr. Juan Bernal, County Engineer, explained that the Road and Bridge Department would need to lease the equipment to perform the project in-house, but noted that there were issues regarding the right-of-way which were not resolved.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, this Item was **(TABLED)**.

**(9) AUTHORIZATION FOR JANITORIAL SERVICES
CONTRACT TO BE RENEWED FOR FISCAL 1999-
2000 FOR THE ENGINEERING AND RIGHT OF
WAY DEPARTMENT**

Upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, the Janitorial Service Contract for Fiscal Year 1999-2000 for the Engineering and Right-of-Way Department was renewed.

The Contract is as follows:

(10) IN THE MATTER OF POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING EL NORTE SUBDIVISION IN THE LAGUNA VISTA AREA (TABLED)

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, this item was (TABLED).

(11) AUTHORIZATION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT WITH AMBIOTECH TO PROVIDE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR ASBESTOS ABATEMENT/LEAD PAINT REMOVAL OF THE DANCY BUILDING

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Contract with Ambiotech, to provide plans and specifications for asbestos abatement and/or lead paint removal of the Dancy Building, be negotiated, said funding to be allocated from the Dancy Building Fund.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously.

(12) AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT BLUE JAY CIRCLE AND CARDINAL COURT, LOCATED IN THE PEDERSON BROTHERS NO. 3 SUBDIVISION, PRECINCT NO. 3, INTO THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz , seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, Blue Jay Circle and Cardinal Court, located in the Pederson Brothers No. 3 Subdivision, Precinct No. 3, were accepted into the County Road System.

(13) AUTHORIZATION OF INCREASE TO RENTAL FEES ON CERTAIN R.V. SITES WITHIN THE CAMERON COUNTY PARKS SYSTEM

At this time, Mr. Javier Mendez explained that the fees on the gulf view lots would be increased to the amount of \$480.00, a month and added that the fees would be increased to \$500.00, a month upon completion of the recreation area.

Commissioner Benavides moved that the rental fees on certain Recreational Vehicle (RV) sites within the Cameron County Parks System be increased.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously.

(14) APPROVAL TO COMBINE THE 1997 CITIZEN REVIEW PANEL AND THE 1999 BUILDING COMMITTEE PURSUANT TO THE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION COMPONENT FOR THE RESTORATION OF THE DANCY BUILDING AND CAMERON COUNTY APPLICATION FOR STATE FUNDING.

Commissioner Cascos moved that 1997 Citizen Review Panel and the 1999 Building Committees be combined, pursuant to the community participation component for the restoration of the Dancy Building and Cameron County Application for State Funding.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

(15) ACTION TO PROVIDE FREE FLU VACCINE FOR CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEES AND FAMILIES

Commissioner Cascos moved that flue vaccines be provided for Cameron County employees and their families free of charge.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, Reserve Deputy Eloy Garcia was approved for Constable Precinct No. 4.

At this time, Mr. Robert Mendoza, Elections Administrator, requested that the touch screen devices be utilized in the Early Voting Election on November 2, 1999, in order to determine whether the system would be functional for the County and noted that the system had been recommended by the Elections Commission. Mr. Mendoza explained that the trial run of the system would allow the Elections System Task-Force to determine whether to utilize the system or research an alternate system to recommend to the Court. He briefly explained how the functions and advantages of the Electronic System and noted that the System would be set up in four (4) designated places and mobile sites.

Judge Hinojosa expressed concern as to providing the option of Electronic voting and paper ballots for the voters and suggested that the matter be referred to the Secretary of State's Office.

At this time, the following individuals expressed their opposition to the Electronic Voting Device:

Mr. Manuel Hernandez, Brownsville resident,

Ms. Teresa Freidy, Precinct Chair and Election worker, and

Ms. Juanita Brodecky, Rio Hondo resident.

Commissioner Matz expressed his concern as to the issues regarding the acceptance of the change by the voters, the apathy and the disability issues which had not been addressed.

Judge Hinojosa stated the voters would be reluctant to change to the Electronic Device System and would result in a low voter turnout.

Upon motion by Commissioner Valencia, seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously, this Item was **(TABLED)**.



(2) **IN THE MATTER OF UTILIZING THE SHERIFF-S DEPARTMENT MOBILE COMMAND CENTER AS A MOBILE VOTING CENTER DURING OCTOBER 21-24 1999, FOR THE NOVEMBER 1999 GENERAL ELECTION (TABLED)**

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to the vehicle-s signage being properly concealed since the Sheriff was an announced candidate, in order to avoid problems with the other candidates.

Commissioner Valencia expressed his opposition to the vehicle, due to the signage concerning the County Sheriff and added that the matter would create controversy among the candidates.

Commissioner Cascos moved that Sheriff-s Department Mobile Command Center be utilized as a Mobile Voting Center during October 21-24, 1999, for the November 1999 General Election.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried as follows:

At this time, Commissioner Cascos questioned whether the mobile command unit met the ADA requirements and Mr. Robert Mendoza, Elections Administrator, replied that the vehicle was not ADA compliant.

Commissioner Cascos stated that there was some confusion as to the ADA requirements being made and suggested that the matter be (TABLED) until the issues were clarified.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, this Item was (TABLED).

- f) **Deliberation regarding Real Property concerning Cameron County Trustee Property, known as Brownsville Elizabeth Heights, Block No. 1, Lot No. 2.**

Upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Benavides and carried unanimously, the Property Manager Coordinator was directed negotiate the Cameron County Trustee Property, known as Brownsville Elizabeth Heights, Block No. 1, Lot No. 2, with the highest bidder.

There being no further business to come before the Court, upon motion by Commissioner Cascos, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the meeting was **ADJOURNED** at 12:14 P.M.
