BE IT REMEMBERED on the 21st day of DECEMBER, 1999, there was conducted a REGULAR Public Meeting of the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Cameron County, Texas, at the Courthouse thereof, in the City of Brownsville, Texas, for the purpose of transacting any and all business that may lawfully be brought before the same.

The meeting was called to order by Judge Gilberto Hinojosa at 9:35 A.M. He then asked Mr. Bob Clark, Brownsville resident, for the invocation and Commissioner Cascos to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on December 17, 1999, at 11:02 A.M.:

#### (33) EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Court met in Executive Session at 9:36 A.M., to discuss the following matters:

i) Deliberation regarding Economic Development negotiations with Magne Tek/Finsa; pursuant to Vernon Texas Code Annotated (V.T.C.A.), Government Code, Section 551.086 (1)(2).

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the Court reconvened in Regular Session at 10:02 A.M.

#### (34) ACTION RELATIVE TO EXECUTIVE SESSION

i) Deliberation regarding Economic Development negotiations with Magne Tek/Finsa.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, Ms. Dylbia Jefferies-Vega, Commissioners= Court Legal Counsel, was directed to draft a letter requesting an Attorney General=s opinion concerning interpretations on abatements regarding the Economic Development negotiations with Magne Tek/Finsa.

### (1) APPROVAL OF COUNTY CLAIMS

At this time, Commissioner Cascos expressed concern as to Warrant No. 25167, payable to San Benito News and Mr. Mark Yates, County Auditor, responded that the extended hours at the Los Indios Bridge had been advertised in the newspaper.

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the County Claims were approved, as presented by the County Auditor.

The Budget Officer-s Comments Report is as follows:

### (2) APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND/OR SALARY SCHEDULES

Commissioner Matz moved that the 1999 Fiscal Year Budget Amendment No. 99-56, the 2000 Fiscal Year Budget Amendment No. 2000-10, and the Salary Schedules for TB PC, Fund No. 260-6460 and Immunizations, Fund No. 240-6380, be approved.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

The Budget Amendments and Salary Schedules are as follow:

(3) APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 2, 1999, NOVEMBER 8, 1999, NOVEMBER 9, 1999, NOVEMBER 16, 1999, NOVEMBER 23, 1999, AND NOVEMBER 30, 1999.

At this time, Commissioner Cascos explained that County Counsel had expressed concerns as to the vote at the previous Meeting for the Minutes of November 2, 1999, and November 8, 1999, which consisted of two (2) votes in favor, zero (0) against, and (2) abstentions. He stated that County Counsel noted that the Item did not contain fifty-one percent (51%) of the votes and; therefore, the matter had not been approved.

Upon motion by Judge Hinojosa, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, this Item was **TABLED** for one (1) week.

### (12) DISCUSSION ON OVERWEIGHT TRUCKS ON COUNTY ROADS AND BRIDGES

At this time, Mr. Juan Bernal, County Engineer, stated that there was a problem with overweight trucks traveling on County roads and bridges which have truck weight limits.

Commissioner Cascos stated that the problem existed on Robindale and Old Alice Roads and added that the trucks were not complying with the weight limit signs in the area. He stated that discussions had been held concerning equipment to weigh the trucks, but noted that there were issues concerning the cost of the equipment and the personnel to operate the equipment.

Judge Hinojosa stated that the Department of Transportation should assist in controlling the traveling of overweight trucks on County Roads and Bridges. He suggested that the trucks should be detained by County Law Enforcement until the trucks are weighed or that the trucks be escorted to the proper weighing locations. He added that the Deputies should frequently patrol the problem areas and stated that the traveling of overweight trucks would eventually decrease.

Sheriff Omar Lucio, Cameron County Sheriff, stated that the Sheriff-s Department would coordinate with the Texas Department of Transportation and suggested that the overweight vehicles be escorted to the appropriate weighing locations.

Judge Hinojosa stated that the Sheriffs Department Budget be analyzed at the mid year review, in order to determine the increase of two (2) Deputies to address the matter and requested that the Sheriff implement a plan to submit to the Court. He stated that a Resolution be adopted authorizing the County Engineer to designate specific roads and bridges to preclude trucks with a certain number of axles from those roads and/or bridges, noting that the County Engineer submit a list of the roads and bridges.

Commissioner Cascos suggested that permits be issued to trucks which needed to travel on said roads and/or bridges where a construction project existed.

Commissioner Valencia moved that the discussion on overweight trucks on County Roads and Bridges be acknowledged.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Matz and carried unanimously.

- (4) APPROVAL TO INSTALL A PHONE LINE TO CONNECT WITH THE CAMERON COUNTY COMPUTER CENTER WITH A MONTHLY COST FOR FRAME RELAY SERVICE OF \$270.91 PER MONTH
- (8) APPROVAL OF A FRAME RELAY CONNECTION TO SERVE THE GOOLSBY BUILDING IN SAN BENITO TO CONNECT THE INDIGENT ELIGIBILITY OFFICE WITH THE INDIGENT HEALTH CARE DATA BASED, LOCATED IN THE COURTHOUSE
- (15) AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT BETWEEN CAMERON COUNTY AND SOUTHWESTERN BELL TO PROVIDE A FRAME RELAY SERVICE TERM PRICING PLAN

Commissioner Matz moved that a phone line be installed to connect with the Cameron County Computer Center with a monthly cost for Frame Relay Service of \$270.91, per month, that the Frame Relay Connection be approved to serve the Goolsby Building in San Benito to connect the Indigent eligibility Office with the Indigent Health Care Data Base, located in the courthouse and that the Agreement between Cameron County and Southwestern Bell be approved to provide a Frame Relay Service Term Pricing Plan.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

(5) IN THE MATTER OF THE CONTRACT BETWEEN CAMERON COUNTY AND MARIA GUADALUPE ESQUIVEL TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH DIETETIC INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (TABLED)

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, this Item was **TABLED** for one (1) week.

(6) IN THE MATTER OF THE CONCESSIONAIRE AGREEMENT FOR THE SEA RANCH MARINA WITH LEWISVILLE 9/4 INCORPORATED, PURSUANT TO THE ORIGINAL CONCESSIONAIRE AGREEMENT WITH S.R. MARINE CENTER, INCORPORATED (TABLED)

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, this Item was **TABLED**.

(7) AUTHORIZATION TO COLLECT A \$20 FEE FOR A NEW CONSTRUCTION PERMIT AND \$10 FEE PER LOT FOR NEW SUBDIVISION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING RURAL ADDRESS MAPPING SERVICES AND AUTHORIZATION TO CHARGE \$25 FOR A 24"X 36" MAP AND \$35 FOR LARGER SIZE MAPS

At this time, Mr. Juan Bernal, County Engineer, stated that the amount of \$25.00 was too high and suggested that the price of the County Road Map should remain at \$15.00.

Judge Hinojosa explained that a fee schedule had been created to implement a program whereas, the County would assume the funding of the Rural Address Mapping System, in order to provide addresses and retain them in a central data base system for new subdivisions and houses constructed as of the effective date of the policy. He stated that the addresses on subdivisions and houses constructed prior to the implementation of the policy would also need to be retained and added that the program would require transferring an employee from the County Engineer's Office to the Auditor's Office with additional personnel to assist, noting that the program would be funded from the subdivision fees.

Commissioner Cascos moved to collect a \$20 fee for a new Construction Permit and \$10 Fee per lot for new subdivision for the purpose of providing rural address mapping services, and authorization to charge \$25 for a 24"x 36" map and \$35 for larger size maps, to be effective January 1, 2000.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

## (9) AUTHORIZATION TO CLOSE GATEWAY INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE ON DECEMBER 15, 1999, FROM 12:00 NOON TO 12:30 P.M.

Commissioner Matz moved that Gateway International Bridge be closed on December 15, 1999, from 12:00 P.M. to 12:30 P.M.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously.

# (10) AUTHORIZATION TO PURCHASE SERVICES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE DISTRICT CLERK LIAISON IMAGING PROJECT USING REGION 4 STATE PURCHASING

Upon motion by Commissioner Matz, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the purchase of services and equipment for the District Clerk Liaison Imaging Project using Region 4 State Purchasing was approved.

## (11) ACTION ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF S&B ENGINEERS FOR THE UTILITY PROVIDERS FOR THE COUNTY JAIL

At this time, Mr. Mike Riojas, S&B Infrastructure, Ltd., highlighted the Cameron County Facilities Master Plan Proposed Utilities Report and recommended that the Public Utilities Board be utilized as the utility provider for the facilities.

Judge Hinojosa clarified that the Olmito Water Supply Corporation had not been recommended due to the uncertainty of the facilities being constructed to provide water and sewer within the time lines. He added that there was not a guarantee as to the grant/loan ratio to be received by the Federal Government for the expansion, noting that the rates reflected in the report might change. He suggested that the recommendations by S&B Engineers be accepted, on the condition that the Public Utilities Board matched the Olmito Water Supply Corporation rates and added that if the condition was not met, the County would then negotiate with the Olmito Water Supply Corporation.

Upon motion by Judge Hinojosa, seconded by Commissioner Valencia and carried unanimously, the recommendation of S&B Engineers to negotiate with Public Utilities Board to provide utilities for the County Jail was approved, subject to the condition that Public Utilities Board match or offer better rates than the Olmito Water Supply Corporation, noting that if the conditions were not met, negotiations would be made with the Olmito Water Supply Corporation.

At this time, there was some discussion concerning the alternate plan if the Public Utilities Board was unable to provide the same rates as the Olmito Water Supply Corporation and the recommendation was made that the financial constraints of the Olmito Water Supply Corporation should be addressed, in order to make a determination as to the availability of the utilities within the time lines.

(13) IN THE MATTER OF THE LEASE RENEWAL FOR THE OFFICE BUILDING, LOCATED AT 1100 FM/802, SUITE 101, BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS, 78526, FROM JANUARY 1, 2000, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2000 (TABLED)
