MARCH 3, 2008 – SPECIAL MEETING

Upon motion by Commissioner Garza, seconded by Commissioner Tamayo and carried unanimously, the Minutes for the March 3, 2008- Regular Meeting were approved.

(D) CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF WORK AUTHORIZATION NO. 2 WITH JWH & ASSOCIATES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PRESIDENTIAL PERMIT AMENDMENT FOR THE VETERANS INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE AT LOS TOMATES. (PSJ-ADMINISTRATOR) (Contract No. 2008C03086)

Mr. Pete Sepulveda, County Administrator-“Judge and Commissioners, as you all know, we have been working on expanding the Veteran’s Bridge at Los Tomates because of the congestion problems that exist today with the mixture of passenger vehicles and commercial vehicles. Up until a couple of weeks ago, we had talked about doing an expansion on the U.S. side and we’re going to stay within the U.S. territory and we were not going to go into the line of demarcation that the International Boundary and Water Commission sets. So we had been coordinating with the Coast Guard and with the State Department. We had not gotten a response from the State Department as to whether or not they were going to require that we amend our presidential permit but based on a meeting we had with them about (30) days ago, they had told us that we would probably not be required to amend it because we were going to stay within the U.S. territory. In the last (3) weeks, we have had (2) meetings with Mexico and the approach has changed. Initially when we began working on this project about (18) to (24) months ago, TxDOT was going to fund 80% of the cost on the U.S. side, Cameron County was going to fund 10% and then the City of Brownsville was going to fund 10%. As I mentioned, in the last (3) weeks we have had (2) meetings with Secretaría de Comunicaciones y Transportes in Mexico and Mexico is interested in building their portion of the Bridge. According to them, they have funding to be able to undertake that project; that changes the entire complexion of the project for us. When we were in Washington about (2) weeks ago, we has another meeting with the State Department and we took a schematic which we included in your packet. We included a schematic of a twin bridge, a four-lane bridge, all the way from the U.S. side to the Mexican side. The day after we met with the State Department in Washington I got an e-mail from the State Department saying that, based on the new project scope, they would require that the County amend the presidential permit to accommodate the new twin structure that we plan on undertaking. On the U.S. side, again, the funding is going to remain as is: 80% form TxDOT and then 10% each from the City of Brownsville and Cameron County; and Mexico, like I said, they would be responsible for

their portion of the Bridge. Having received that notice from the State Department, we need to move forward in preparing the amendment to the presidential permit that we currently have for the Veteran's Bridge. I prepared an outline that I sent to the State Department basically giving them an opportunity to review the outline and see if that is the format that they will require for the amendment of the permit and to see if that is the information that needs to be included in the amendment of the permit. I have not gotten a response from them but I feel pretty confident that the outline will contain the information that they will require. In the meantime, we do want to move forward with that preparation and we previously had approved a contract with JWH & Associates. Mr. Hudson was the one that prepared the original presidential permit application for the Veteran's Bridge. He is the one that prepared the presidential permit application for the West Rail Bridge, so he is extremely familiar with the process. I have run the outline through him and we made some modifications to it. Staff recommendation is for approval. We will budget this from the Veteran's Bridge operating budget."

Commissioner Tamayo-"So you have the funding?"

Mr. Sepulveda-"Yes."

Commissioner Garza-"Pete, any idea as far as the timeline for the process to happen?"

Mr. Sepulveda-"Yes, the amendment to the permit, we're hoping that in a period of (4) months we can do that. With the submittal of the amended presidential permit application, we will have to submit an amended environmental assessment; since we are doing the entire bridge it will have some impact, so we will need to coordinate the environmental assessment or the update of the environmental assessment with the Coast Guard and the International Boundary and Water Commission. We are hoping that within that same timeframe, which is four months, we can do that and be able to submit that amendment of the environmental assessment with the application; that needs to happen. Mexico has also told us that their funding situation, they need to start utilizing their funding by at least the first quarter of 2009. They want for us to have a design complete by this summer, so we are under the gun a little bit but I think that is enough time for us to do what we need to do as far as our permits and our environmental assessment. It's a process we're familiar with; the agencies are the same agencies that we've dealt with before on other similar projects. You know we are going to have to fast-track it but I feel confident that we can keep that schedule. We have done some early coordination so that should save us some time when we are dealing with some of those agencies."

Commissioner Garza-"Thank you."

Judge Cascos-"Any further discussion? Do I hear a motion to approve and authorize the use of JWH & Associates for the Development of the Presidential Permit?"

Commissioner Tamayo-"Motion for approval."

Commissioner Benavides-“Second.”

Judge Cascos-“Moved by Commissioner Tamayo, seconded by Commissioner Benavides. All those in favor signify by saying ‘aye’.”

Commissioner Tamayo, Commissioner Benavides and Commissioner Garza-“Aye.”

Judge Cascos-“Any opposed? Item carries.”
